The Connecticut Sports Foundation (CSF) is a nonprofit organization with a 501 (c)(3) designation.

CSF has operated for 28 years under the guidance of Jane G. Ellis, Executive Director. The Foundation is overseen by a 15-member volunteer Board of Directors, and a 10-member volunteer Advisory Board of Directors.

CSF supporters can be assured that their generous donations are most effectively being used to help ease the financial burdens of Connecticut families due to a cancer diagnosis.

CSF has been audited by an independent accounting firm for the past 28 years and is presently audited by Cohn Reznik.

Our Mission

To financially assist Connecticut cancer patients and their families, and to fund cancer research.

About the Connecticut Sports Foundation

CSF was founded in 1987 by Connecticut native John Ellis, a former catcher and first baseman for the New York Yankees and cancer survivor, to provide economic assistance and compassionate aid to cancer patients and their families in his home state.

John is passionate about helping others as his life was touched by cancer in several ways: He lost a sister, a brother, and a sister-in-law to cancer, all before they reached the age of 40. Then, John himself was diagnosed with Hodgkin's disease, also prior to the age of 40. Fortunately John survived and CSF was born. John has served as the Chairman of the CSF Board of Directors for many years and is an active Board Member and avid fundraiser for the charity he founded more than two decades ago.

Through its **Grant Recipient Program**, CSF is able to help the majority of Connecticut families requesting assistance through referrals from oncology social workers from hospitals, cancer treatment centers and hospices throughout the state. For the past 28 years, CSF has quietly granted over \$4 million to more than 4,000 Connecticut families dealing with the financial hardship that often comes along with a cancer diagnosis. In addition, the Foundation has donated more than \$1.7 million to support ongoing cancer research at Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center.

To raise funds and awareness for CSF's **Grant Recipient Program**, CSF conducts an Annual Celebrity Dinner & Sports Memorabilia Auction fundraiser. The annual fundraiser is orchestrated with the assistance of more than 75 volunteers, including the CSF Board of Directors, Advisory Board members and Emeritus Board members. The many hospitals, cancer centers and hospices, whose patients are served by CSF also support the annual fundraiser as they know firsthand how deserving and in-need the grant recipients are.





ILROG Appreciates the Continued Support Of the Connecticut Sports Foundation to Our Mission and Lymphoma Research

CONNECTICUT SPORTS FOUNDATION (CSF) was founded in 1987 by Connecticut native John C. Ellis, a former catcher for the New York Yankees who played major league baseball for thirteen years. John lost a sister, a brother, and a sister-in-law to lymphoma. He is a survivor of a very bulky stage III Hodgkin lymphoma that involved the chest and the spleen and was diagnosed before John reached 40. John was treated, almost thirty years ago, with extensive radiation alone. No chemotherapy. Fortunately, John survived and CSF was born, with the idea of raising funds through sports with the help of sports celebrities. CSF has been operating for 28 years under the guidance of John's wife, Jane G. Ellis, President and Executive Director of CSF.

CSF began its fundraising efforts in 1988, kicking off its first gala fundraiser with baseball legends, Mickey Mantle, Whitey Ford and

Billy Martin where Mickey stated: "I hope this Foundation goes on forever". Over the years, many of MLB's greatest stars, Joe DiMaggio, Yogi Berra, Hank Aaron along with many others attended the gala to help build CSF's success to date. CSF is one of the only organizations in Connecticut that provides financial assistance directly to cancer patients and is still going strong. For the past 28 years, through its Cancer Assistance Program, CSF has granted over \$3.8 million to more than 4,000 Connecticut families facing financial hardship that often follows a cancer diagnosis.

In 1992, CSF began supporting lymphoma research with a \$10,000 grant to John's radiation oncologist-Dr. Joachim Yahalom; the commitment to support research has continued for the last 25 years, providing generous funding to support ongoing cancer research at Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center under the direction of

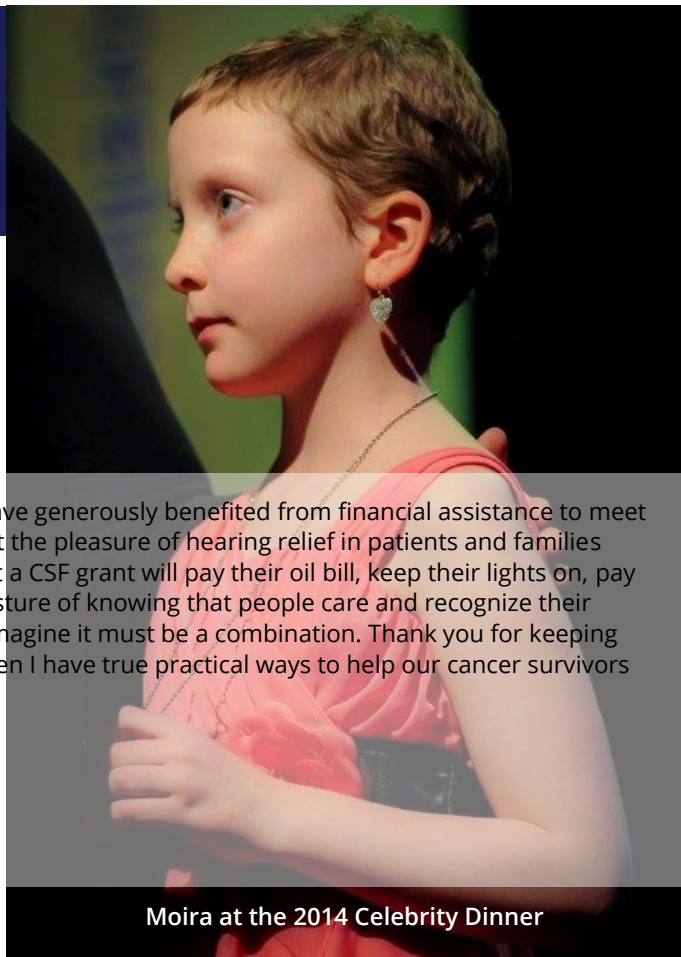
The Foundation at Work

I am writing this letter on behalf of the Connecticut Sports Foundation Against Cancer. Over the past several years I have requested support from this organization for the patients I serve here in our small community hospital.

In southeastern Connecticut I have seen countless patients, who are unemployed, underemployed, have lost a job due to illness, or just cannot make ends meet. These patients are mostly working class individuals for whom there is no other financial assistance available. It is heartbreaking to see these families suffer financially in addition to their physical suffering.

I have witnessed the relief of stress this organization provides when a patient receives a check. The check is most often in the amount requested by the patient and can be for help with mortgage payments, non-covered medical equipment, utility bills, COBRA payments, etc.

I cannot state strongly enough that this stress relief is critical for the patient's ability to combat their cancer as well as the side effects of the treatment for the cancer. I know of no other organization like this one, which provides such immediate and necessary financial support to cancer patients.

I hold this organization and its staff in the highest regard and I am grateful for their consistent positive response to my patients' requests.
